

First Level Additional Activities - Cross Curricular Home Learning

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Play "I Spy". Describe something you can see. Can your partner guess?	After you watch a favourite TV show, tell someone about it. Include the beginning, middle and end.	Take turns with someone naming words that have 'ing' in them. The winner will be the one who names the longest 'ing' word.	Make as many maths problems as you can that have 30 for an answer.	Go on a "recycling" scavenger hunt. List or draw pictures of 10 things in your home that can be recycled.
Will an egg float or sink in water? Find out. Then add salt one teaspoon at a time. What Happens?	Make a map of your street. Include shops and other areas of interest.	Ask an adult for a piece of junk mail or a take away menu. Circle all the words you can find that have more than two vowels contained in the word.	Write an acrostic poem with the word CELEBRATION.	Estimate how many times you can count backward from 30 in one minute. Try it!
Make a poster that will display three ways you can help to protect the planet.	Go on a "materials" scavenger hunt. Find 3 things in your home that are made of cotton, plastic and wood.	Create a new sandwich with your favourite filling. Make a flyer to advertise this new sandwich, give it a name.	Put 20 objects on a table. Close your eyes and ask someone to take away one object. What is missing?	Take a poll. Find out the favourite food of each family member. Display your results in a bar graph.
Help to wash the dishes.	Tidy your bedroom.	Write a book review about a book we have read in school.	Think about one nice thing to say to someone you know. Tell it to that person.	Design a new book cover for your favourite book.
Look inside your kitchen cupboard or fridge/freezer. Find out which product has the highest calorie content by looking at the package label.	Create a new playground game. Write down the rules for this game.	Find out how many days there are in May. Which day does the 12 th fall on? Which day would it have fallen on 4 years ago.	Look out of a window in your home. Why not draw what you see?	Gather 10 household objects. Sort them according to weight. Can you sort them another way?
