

Early Level Additional Activities – Cross Curricular Home Learning



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| Play "I Spy". Describe something you can see. Can your partner guess? | After you watch a favourite TV show, tell someone about it. Include the beginning, middle and end. | Take turns with someone naming words the start with the letter M. | Make as many maths problems as you can that have 12 for an answer. | Go on a "red" scavenger hunt. List or draw pictures of 10 red things in your home. |
| Will an egg float or sink in water? Find out. Then add salt one teaspoon at a time. What Happens? | Make a map of your street. Include shops and other areas of interest. | Ask an adult for a piece of junk mail or a take away menu. Circle all the words you can find that have an 'e' in them. | Write a sentence using as many words as you can that start with the letter 'j'. | Estimate how many times you can count backward from 20 in one minute. Try it! |
| List three ways you help to protect the planet. What else can you do? | Go on a "touch" scavenger hunt. Find something soft, bumpy and smooth. | Make a list of all foods you eat in one day. How many are fruits? How many are vegetables? | Put 20 objects on a table. Close your eyes and ask someone to take away one object. What is missing? | Take a poll. Find out the favourite food of each family member. |
| Help to wash the dishes. | Tidy your bedroom. | Tell someone about a book we have read in school. | Think about one nice thing to say to someone you know. Tell it to that person. | Estimate how many steps from your kitchen to your bedroom. Count them and see if you are correct. |
| Look inside your kitchen cupboard or fridge/freezer/ How many food products come in cuboid shaped packaging? | Try a new fruit of vegetable. | Find out how many days there are in April. Which day does the 12 th fall on? | Look out of a window in your home. Why not draw what you see? | Gather 10 household objects. Sort them according to length. Can you sort them another way? |
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
