Photographer

Tempus photography will be with us on *Wednesday 30th October* for class photos. This will alternate with individual portraits, next time. If you do not wish your child to participate, just advise through the school office.

Our Lady of Peace Primary has been recognised for its participation in a wide variety of sports and after school active clubs. Well done to everyone involved in achieving this. We are now aiming for the Gold Award which is achievable with lots of effort and increased participation in all of the clubs on offer. Our Sports Captains and Sports Leaders deserve a big round of applause!

PE Kits

Sadly, many of the children are coming to school without the correct attire for Physical Education lessons. On one recent check, more than a third of the class had no kit. This can be unsafe if participating with inappropriate footwear and taking PE in school uniform may be unhygienic, especially for the older children. No one is allowed to sit out as PE is a crucial part of the curriculum.

PE kits should be brought to school, in a drawstring bag/similar on a Monday and taken home for washing on a Friday. Please label all items and the bag.

Indoor shoes

These must be worn by all children for their own comfort and to keep the school indoor environment clean.

Water bottles

We encourage the children to keep hydrated and there are fresh water fonts to facilitate this. Please provide a water bottle for this purpose. The children are asked to come to school in the morning with the bottle filled to minimise disruptions to teaching and learning.

This will be on *Thursday 31st October* with follow up workshops for P4-P5 stages. It will help support our health and wellbeing curriculum and I am sure the children will enjoy the performance. No pupils should be taken out of school at lunchtime if at all possible, as this disrupts very busy, lunchtime arrangements. Our younger children, who bring their costumes with them to school, will get help to dress for the parade.
